Village matters	<p><u>Gritting</u>: Supplies now bought and stored in the Village Hall.</p> <p><u>Signage</u>: a format and options have been discussed to inform a costing/branding/style guide to improve the signage across the village – in progress</p> <p><u>Wilding Project</u> (encouraging more wild flowers in the village): Permissions from both GYBC and NCC (application approved) received and AGREED. No grass cutting will take place at all from GYBC across these areas. Cllrs are working to provide a schedule of work to ensure the areas are maintained and provide some wording for signs to be place to inform people that the areas are growing wild as part of a project.</p> <p><u>1 million Trees Project Permissions</u> – Council has obtained permission from GYBC to proceed to plant trees on the playing field and no objection has been raised to the play area.</p>
